

## CKC LAUNCHES FIRST OFFICIAL RESPIRATORY FUNCTION GRADING SCHEME SCREENING CLINIC

March 11 & 12, 2023

In conjunction with the Scarborough Kennel Club All-Breed Championship Dog Shows Lindsay Exhibition Grounds, The Commonwell Mutual Insurance Building 354 Angeline Street South, Lindsay, Ontario

(Anticipated clinic hours are 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Saturday and 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on Sunday)

The Canadian Kennel Club is thrilled to partner with the Orthopedic Foundation for Animals (OFA) to bring the Respiratory Function Grading Scheme (RFG Scheme) to Canada - beginning with the first official screening clinic in March 2023. OFA licensed the RFG Scheme for North America in late 2022 and launched its first official RFG Scheme screening in January 2023. This development follows many discussions about the RFG Scheme between CKC, the UK Kennel Club and the University of Cambridge - with the support of CKC's Brachycephalic Breeds Advocacy Committee. CKC recognizes the importance of this initiative, to support members in promoting and preserving the health and wellbeing of all purebred dogs, including brachycephalic (short-nosed) breeds.

CKC was pleased to sponsor Canadian lead examiner, Dr. Allison Collier, Assistant Professor, University of Guelph, to train in Portland, OR with OFA-trained lead examiners at the US launch. Dr. Collier's experience was positive, and she looks forward to mentoring other Canadian veterinarians this year. CKC is also pleased to have Dr. Ameet Singh, DVM, Professor of Small Animal Surgery, University of Guelph, on board as a Canadian lead examiner for the RFG Scheme in Canada. This is the first of several RFG Scheme screening clinics to be planned this year.

There is no charge for the OFA registration or exam at CKC's first official RFG Scheme screening clinic. At future events, the standard OFA registration will be \$15 USD and the veterinary exam fees will be set by each examining veterinarian.

#### About the RFG Scheme

The RFG Scheme, also known as Brachycephalic Obstructive Airway System (BOAS) Testing, was developed by researchers at the University of Cambridge in the UK as an objective test to measure the clinical diagnosis and severity of BOAS. The purpose of the RFG Scheme is to increase understanding about the condition, increase awareness, and ultimately reduce the incidence of BOAS. In addition, responsible breeders may use the tool to screen their breeding stock and include the results in their selection criteria.

## Supporting Breed Health

Supporting members in promoting and preserving the health and wellbeing of all purebred dogs, including brachycephalic breeds, is a key area of focus for CKC. In 2022, CKC hosted breed club webinars and a national symposium on healthy dog breeding, in collaboration with subject matter experts such as breed clubs of brachycephalic breeds, the Canadian Veterinary Medical Association (CVMA), the International Partnership for Dogs (IPFD) and Royal Canin. CKC is also developing an Integrated Breed Health Program (more information on this initiative will be available in the coming months), that includes breeder education, breed health strategies, a DNA program, and more, to compliment initiatives like the RFG Scheme and support member breeders with ongoing science-based education and best practices.

We will continue to work with the national breed clubs for the Pug, Bulldog and French Bulldog to arrange additional events and collaborate with key stakeholders to promote and preserve the health and wellbeing of all purebred dogs, including brachycephalic breeds. Watch for more details in the weeks ahead.

## NOTICE TO CONFORMATION JUDGES AND CLUBS RE: NEW **BREEDS – JUDGING PANEL** APPLICATIONS

This is a reminder that the following breeds became eligible for competition in 2022 and 2023:

> Yakutian Laika **Biewer Terrier** Grand Basset Griffon Vendeen Appenzeller Sennenhund Bergamasco Shepherd Dog

In accordance with CKC policy, CKC All Breed Judges and Breed/Group Judges that are licensed or on permit to judge groups in which these new breeds have been designated, will be required to successfully complete an Open Book Test.

Notices were sent out to all Conformation Judges each time the required Open Book Test became available.

The Breed Standards and Open Book Tests for all of these breeds, with the exception of the Yakutian Laika, are available on the CKC website under Events, CKC Breed Standards, New Breed Open Book Test.

# GOVERNMENT OF NOVA SCOTIA TO REVISIT DEVELOPMENT OF PET ESTABLISHMENT REGULATIONS

CKC recently learned that the Government of Nova Scotia is considering re-forming the Minister's Forum on Animal Welfare given renewed interest regarding the development of regulations for pet establishments under the Animal Protection Act. We have been in touch with the Minister's office to offer our assistance and expertise on this matter.

As you may know, CKC's Zone 1 Director, Frank MacArthur, was invited to join a sub-committee of the Minister's Forum in 2021 to draft recommendations on the regulation and licensing of pet establishments in Nova Scotia. CKC and our members support the humane treatment of animals and the efforts of the Nova Scotia Government and SPCA to eliminate any abuses of dogs across our province. However, there was a lack of transparent governance regarding the 2021 development process for Pet Establishment Regulations and CKC appreciates the current Ministry's plan to take a more balanced approach on future development of licensing and regulations for pet establishments, including kennels.

Your Nova Scotia team, including Frank MacArthur, Emily Gratton, Nova Scotia representative on the CKC National Advocacy & Government Relations Committee and Lendra Barker, Past Zone 1 Director continue to work with our Nova Scotia focus group and CKC head office to keep you informed about this evolving situation.

CKC and its members want to work with the Nova Scotia government, the NS SPCA and other stakeholders, to develop regulations that are non-discriminatory, reasonable, and enforceable—that will ensure humane living conditions and ethical practices for all pet facilities.
