

Welcome to the full recording of our 2024 Annual General Meeting (AGM). We are thrilled to share the this year's key moments and discussions highlighting CKC's work.



2023 REFERENDUM APPROVAL BY AGRICULTURE CANADA

We are pleased to announce that CKC has received approval from the Minister of Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada (AAFC) of the 2023 Referendum.

The 2023 Referendum contained 10 By-law updates, 51 Rules of Eligibility (ROE's) and approval of the Dogue de Bordeaux as a recognized breed.

The Rules of Eligibility changes will apply to the following breeds.

Over the coming weeks, CKC will make any necessary changes to our systems and official documents (i.e. forms, policies, etc.) to implement the changes from the 2023 Referendum. We will notify our members when these changes are complete, allowing them to register their Dogue de Bordeaux, view the updated ROE's before registering new dogs, and read the changed bylaws in the updated By-laws booklet.

CKC continues to follow up with Agriculture Canada regarding the approval of the 2022 Referendum. We will provide an update for members as soon as it is possible.

NOTICE TO CONFORMATION JUDGES RE: BREED STANDARDS ල NEW BREEDS

Effective July 1, 2024, the following breeds have revised breed standards:

- · Chow Chow
- · French Bulldog

Effective July 1, 2024, the following new breeds will be eligible to compete in conformation:

Group 2 (Hounds) - VIRINGO

The Viringo has three size varieties:

- Small (judged on the table)
- Medium (judged on the table or ramp)
- Large (judged on the ramp or ground)

Group 7 (Herding) - PUMI The Pumi is judged on the table.

The new breed standards will be posted on the CKC website by July 1. The effective date for all standards appears next to the breed name on the first page of each standard.

You will notice that the Breed Standards have been updated and have a new professional look. As the formatting is finished for each group the entire group will be posted on the CKC website.

UPDATE ON CDC DOG IMPORTATION RULE

DISCLAIMER: the following is a brief summary of the requirements and changes. All information is subject to change at any time and the following is NOT an official record. Please consult the CFIA and CDC websites at all times for the official requirements and most up-to-date information.

We're pleased to provide you with the latest update regarding the Centers for Disease Control's (CDC) Dog Importation Rule effective August 1, 2024.

We are seeing further changes due to the increase in advocacy from CKC and our members, other organizations and ongoing work that CFIA is doing.

Please note that for dogs entering the U.S. from Canada (given that they have been in Canada for a minimum of 6 months), the only form that is required now is the CDC Dog Import Form. You will no longer need to complete an export form for certification by a licensed veterinarian.

The following is required for dogs entering the U.S. from Canada, as of August 1, 2024.

- · be at least 6 months of age
- · appear healthy upon arrival
- · have a universally readable microchip
- · have a CDC Dog Import Form receipt
- · must be submitted through the CDC website
 - a receipt is required for each dog and for every entry into the U.S.
- · instructions on how to fill out the form can be found here

As we have stated before, the situation is still fluid and there could be further changes. We will continue to advocate on behalf of our members and we encourage our members to write letters to the CDC using the TEMPLATE provided. We ask that you keep the requests of the CDC consistent with what CKC and AKC have put forward.
